







Fig. 5: CLASSIFICATION OF MUNICIPALITIES/ COMPONENT CITY

C. TOPOGRAPHY

The topography of the Province of Iloilo varies from flat lands and rolling hills to mountain peaks and ranges. The mountain ranges lie along the border between Iloilo and the provinces of Antique and Capiz, and roll down into flat plains towards the coastal towns. Almost one-third of the entire province is considered flat.

D. CLIMATE RAINFALL(2009)

It is dry from December to June and wet from July to November along the southernnorthern part of the province and portion of the central municipalities. There is no distinct wet and dry season in the Iloilo-Capiz border. The annual rainfall is 2,036.20 mm.

E. SOIL

There are **seventeen types of soil** found in the province. Generally, the soil is fertile and suitable to almost all types of agricultural crops. The loam type of soil is predominant and conducive to farming.

F. WATER SOURCES(as of 2010)

About 175 rivers and creeks traverse the entire province and these are identified as possible sources of irrigation water. The Jalaur river basin records the highest annual flow and is considered as the major source of irrigation water. The province has potential underground water supply, which is mostly tapped for domestic use.








Fig. 7: HOUSEHOLD POPULATION BY AGE GROUP & SEX: 2007 Census






Fig. 9:IN THE LABOR FORCE BY SEX BY QUARTER, 2010





Fig.13: CORN PRODUCTION (MT): 2010






Fig. 14: FOREST COVER *Province of Iloilo:As of 2008*



b.1 The New Iloilo Airport

The **New Iloilo Airport** is located at Brgy. Duyanduyan, Cabatuan, Iloilo with 2,500 m. x 45 m. runway and a new terminal building with state-of-the-art computerized facilities to accommodate flights from the North and South of the country. Stands as one of the busiest airports outside Manila, the new airport of international standard is built on a wider and panoramic location to cater the increasing influx of passengers visiting Iloilo.

The province's airport is one of the major airports of the country and serves as a jump off point to different provinces in Panay accommodating daily flights from Manila and Cebu. The New Iloilo Airport Terminal could now accommodate more passengers and cargoes. The 2,500 m. stretch of runway was overlaid with asphalt to accommodate heavier aircrafts with an adjacent runway strip of 2,620 m. The New Iloilo Airport was inaugurated and started operation last June 13, 2007.




Fig. 16: POWER FACILITIES (PANAY GRID)



4.a) HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL TOURIST DESTINATION

To GOD be the Glory



The present structure of ST. THOMAS OF VILLANOVA PARISHOF

MIAGAOwas started in December Of 1786 and was finished in 1797. As a place of worship and as a fort used in defending the town against Moro raids, the church boasts its artistic façade decorated with relief sculpture of St.


Christopher carrying the Christ child amidst coconut, papaya and guava shrubs. In February 16, 1963 it was awarded a historical marker by the Philippine Historical Commission; declared a National Shrine through a Presidential Decree No. 260 in August 1, 1973; and was listed by the UNESCO as one of the World Cultural Heritage Sites in 1994, the only one in Visayas and Mindanao.



The **ST. JOHN OF SAHAGUN PARISH OF TIGBAUAN**, built in 1578, is a fine example of Churrigueresque architecture or a lavish piling up of surface ornamentation, especially

stone carvings commonly found in Spain and Spanish America. Inside the church is a wide array of carefully laden tile such mosaic the station of the cross at the sides and Dante's interpretation of heaven and earth in its altar. It is said to have one of the most beautiful altar murals in the region.

The Rennaisance-Romanesque architectural structure of ST. CATHERINE OF **ALEXANDRIA PARISH** OF LEON was once known as the biggest stone edifice in the whole of Panay measuring 100 feet in width and 300 feet in length covering almost two streets of the town, Sta. Catalina and Sto. Niño. The rocks used were quarried from neighboring sitios.



The present Filipino-Baroque colonial architecture of SANTA BARBARA CHURCH AND CONVENT were built in 1845 and was finished in 1886. Made of adobe, coral and red bricks, the church and convent served as the headquarter of the Ilonggo Revolutionary Forces under Gen. Delgado Martin in 1898. It was declared as a national historical landmark by the



National Historical Institute.

The **CHURCH OF SAN JOAQUIN**was built in 1859 and finished in 1869. It is the only militaristic church in the Philippines with a bass relief of the historic battle in Tetuan, South Africa. It was constructed not only as a place of worship but as a defensive fortress against the Muslin marauders of the 19th century.



The Tuscan-style ST. THOMAS OF VILLANOVA CHURCH OF CABATUAN was built in 1833 and was finished in 1866. It was noted to be the largest church in northern Iloilo and was much-adored that El Eco de Panay described it as the "Model of Temples".



This one hectare tract of the CATHOLIC CEMETERY OF **JANIUAY**located east from poblacion, situated between barangays Aquino-Nobleza and Damu-ong was built in 1875. Built on top of a hill, it is one of the most beautiful of its kind in the country. It is made up of three grand arched with entrance gates individual staircases. The octagonal-shaped sapilla, partially overgrown with plants and shrubs, is the

centerpiece of the cemetery. In November 20, 1885, the cemetery was finished.

The Baroque architectural style of **ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST PARISH OF DINGLE**was built in 1876 and finished 1886. It is made of limestone quarried from the mountains of Bulabog Puti-an. It welcomes everyone with its 9-step ascending stairway towards the main entrance of the church.

4.b) Natural Tourist Destination

TANGKE, located on the southern side of Barangay Lantangan in Isla de Gigantes Sur, Carles is a hidden saltwater lagoon formed by a surrounding wall of granite monolithic cliffs that serve as the lagoon's fortress. The lagoon's rocky borders offer spelunkers and trekkers a number of caves with one-of-akind formations.

The golden sandy beach of **TAMBALIZA** in Concepcion is famous for its landmark, Mt. Manaphag or Pan de Azucar, the gem of the island. There is plenty of lush greenery and the ocean is a beautiful greenish hue that merges into a dark blue out in the open waters of the island.

BULABOG PUTI-ANin Dingle offers a rare

opportunityto get close to one of Iloilo'srarest limestone rock formation in Panayexcluding Guimaras. It is situated in an areaof rich biodiversity with caves that createrare natural situation for its fragileenvironment. This old growth forest is also a perfect laboratory for the study of flora and fauna.

THE SANDBAR BEACH RESORT in BULUBADIANGAN is a satellite island of barangay Polopiña in Concepcion. It is a

45-minutermotorized boat ride from the wharf. It is considered as a local's favorite because of its long stretch of sandbar. It has tent sites and picnic facilities and faces Offshore Mt. Manaphag.

BUCARI in Leon is tagged as the summer capital of the province. It has spacious green areas covered by pine trees is a perfect site for picnic and camping. It is filled with views of parallel mountain chains whereas the altitude increases, vegetation changes from forest to



pine patches of cool temperature.

The beachfront of **BAGO SIPOL ISLAND**in Concepcion is astonishing and almost indescribable. Its water ranges from the palest aquamarine and turquoise to the deepest sapphire matched with its sparkling white sand. Tourist who enjoys swimming and snorkeling are drawn to this island.


SALOG DAKU in Ajuy is a private resort famous for its tranquil beauty. Sprawl by the warm turquoise waters of the island and enjoy a fun-filled holiday on beautiful beaches with your family or relax in the arms of your loved one on an exotic beach holiday.

Known to be the Land of Waterfalls in Iloilo, the Municipality of Lambunao boasts of three prominent waterfalls inside the MARIIT WILDLIFE CONSERVATION PARKlocated inside the West Visayas State

University College of Agriculture and Forestry in Barangay Jayubo, Lambunao is a rescue and captive breeding center that houses exotic birds like Dolongan, and Tarictic Hornbill. It is also home for White-spotted deer, Warty pigs and Racquet-tail Parrots or Dangag. It is also home to three prominent waterfalls namely: Inas, Montillano and Aguas amidst majestic trees and flora endemic to the area.

CASA FIAMETTAin Barangay Tabucan, Barotac Nuevo is a 50minuter drive or 28 kilometers north fron the city. The area's 5-hectare ranch offers riding, camping and kayaking activities, with bike trails and a pool for the whole family to enjoy. It also houses a riding school that offers lessons on English Equitation with modules from basic, intermediate and advanced courses. Accommodations includes airconditioned log cabins withbath suitable for singles, couples andfamily.

SNORKEL amidst the kaleidoscopic marine life and the coral garden in Barangay Cata-an in San Joaquin.If you are a beginner or an experienced diver, the marine reserve in the area will provide you with an amazing experience you will never forget. The best time to go is in the morning before anybody else starts snorkeling. You have the water to yourself and the tranquility of themorning.

DAMIRES HILLS, Tierra Verde located in Barangay Damires in Janiuay is an inland resort an hour from Iloilo City. It has cogon huts, family rooms for an overnight stay, function rooms good for trainings and seminars and a stunning swimming pool. It is open from 7AM to 7PM every weekdays; Saturdays at 7AM to 9PM and Sundays from 7AM to 8PM.

MARBUENA ISLAND **RESORT**in Binongan-an Island, Ajuy is a 25-minuter motorized boat-ride from Barangay Mangorocoro, just 7 kilometers away from the town center.. It boasts of its sandbar and white sand beach with areas where thick mangroves grow over a beautiful beach ocean-front. The resort has airconditioned non-air-conditioned and rooms and offers 4-island tour and 7-island tour around Ajuy.

The **SANTA BARBARA GOLF COURSE** is the oldest existing golf course in the Philippines built in 1907. This 35hectare, 18-hole golf course is carved from plain and rolling hills of Santa Barbara.

For an ecological experience, visit **TAMBALIZA ECO PARK AND RESORT**in Barangay Tambaliza, Concepcion. Everyone will enjoy this relaxing stroll along a boardwalk over a natural mangrove reserve area. The scenic Island of Botlog and the imposing Mt. Manaphag share the beautiful landscape of the area. Amenities include cottages, pavilion, open cottages and floating cottages. Entrance fee is P20.00 for a whole day visit at the park.

The **Southeast Asian Fishieries Development Center or SEAFDEC**is an inter-governmental organization established in December 1967 for the purpose of promoting sustainable fisheries development in the region. This 40-hectare complex includes various laboratories, hatcheries and brood-stock tanks. It also house a museum-aquarium-visitor center dedicated to science and environment education about aquatic ecosystems and biodiversity, aquaculture, fisheries, Ecotourism and the aquatic sciences.








Fig. 21: FAMILY PLANNING BY METHOD OF PREFERENCE BY QUARTER Province of Iloilo: 2011
